AGENCY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH IN NORTHERN IRELAND THE NHS BUSINESS SERVICES AUTHORITY

- 1. This agreement is made between the Department of Health in Northern Ireland ("the Department") and the NHS Business Services Authority ("the NHSBSA") under section 28 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998.
- 2. It relates to functions which in the opinion of the Minister for the Department of Health can appropriately be performed by the NHSBSA in connection with its functions.
- 3. Any reference in this agreement to a piece of legislation is a reference to that legislation as amended before or after the date of this agreement.
- 4. This agreement relates to the exercise of the functions of the Department in relation to the Healthy Start Scheme under the:

Healthy Start Scheme and Day Care Food Scheme Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006.

Specified Functions

- 5. It is agreed that the NHSBSA shall exercise the specified functions as set out below and in the associated Service Level Agreement on behalf of the Department pursuant to section 28 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998 and including:
 - a) details of the administration and operation of the Healthy Start Scheme, including specifications, Key Performance Indicators and funding arrangements;
 - establish and operate a system for the collection and analysis of information from beneficiaries and other government departments to the extent necessary for it to provide confirmation of a person's entitlement to the Healthy Start Scheme;
 - c) develop and operate information and communication systems to operate the Healthy Start Scheme;
 - d) make arrangements to receive and process information from applicants to the Healthy Start Scheme;
 - e) accept, consider and decide applications made to the Healthy Start Scheme:
 - f) develop and apply eligibility criteria to determine applications for the Healthy Start Scheme;

- g) inform applicants to the Healthy Start Scheme of NHSBSA's decisions under the scheme;
- h) make arrangements for the provision of vouchers or credit under the Healthy Start Scheme, comprising the amount of benefit due to -
 - i) a person who is entitled to receive the benefit under the Healthy Start Scheme;
 - ii) a person who has parental responsibility for a child.
- i) pay the beneficiary an amount equal to the value represented by the voucher or credit they would otherwise receive in accordance with the principal Regulations; and
- j) provide a beneficiary with payment or voucher in circumstances where the beneficiary has failed to receive a benefit and meets the criteria set out in the principal Regulations.
- k) enter into and manage, on behalf of the Department, framework agreements, contracts and arrangements with persons who
 - i) manufacture Healthy Start vitamins;
 - ii) store Healthy Start vitamins; and
 - iii) make arrangements for, or in connection with, the distribution and supply of Healthy Start vitamins.
- I) carry out administrative functions relating to the supply of Healthy Start vitamins.
- 6. The Department will represent itself on other matters not relating to the Specified Functions set out in the Service Level Agreement.
- 7. Nothing in this agreement shall prevent the Department from exercising any of the Specified Functions set out in the Service Level Agreement.
- 8. Neither the NHSBSA, nor any of those other bodies, shall exercise any Specified Function mentioned in the written notification received from the Department.
- 9. (a) In exercising the Specified Functions, the NHSBSA must seek such appropriate and timely legal advice in connection with—
 - (i) the administration or operation of the Healthy Start Scheme including the interpretation of the legislation and procedures relating to the administration of the Healthy Start Scheme;

- (ii) the conduct of litigation whether actual or threatened; and-
- (b)The NHSBSA must notify the Department forthwith of any matter (including actual or threatened litigation) in relation to the Heathy Start Scheme which may:
 - (i) challenge any provision of the existing legislation, its interpretation or application; or
 - (b) raise issues of financial or public policy in relation to the Healthy Start Scheme.
- 10. Where the NHSBSA notifies the Department of a matter in accordance with paragraph 9(b) it must:
 - (a) consult with the Department about the conduct of the matter; and
 - (b) ensure that the Department is kept informed of the general progress of the matter and any development which may occur.
- 11.Upon receiving a request by the Department, the NHSBSA must provide information to the Department in relation to any matter concerning the Healthy Start Scheme including in particular, actual or threatened litigation or where issues of public policy or finance may arise.
- 12. The NHSBSA must keep and maintain records of:
 - (a) all applications for benefit under the Healthy Start Scheme; and
 - (b) all children and beneficiaries in receipt of benefits under the Healthy Start Scheme.

13. The NHSBSA must—

- (a) provide annually to the Department a written report on the operation of and the benefits paid under the Healthy Start Scheme, on a date agreed between the Department and NHSBSA; and
- (b) work and liaise with the Department as appropriate.

Transitional Provisions for Existing Claims

- 14. The NHSBSA is required to take reasonable steps to ensure that any party affected by the transfer of the Scheme to the NHSBSA is informed of-
 - (a) any parties affected by the transfer of the scheme to the NHSBSA is accordingly informed of the NHSBSAs remit, of this agreement, and its effect and
 - (b) the Agency Agreement between the NHSBSA and the Department; and
 - (c) the effect of the Agency Agreement.
 - (d) the provisions for continuity of the Healthy Start Scheme as soon as is practicable after the date of remit.
 - (e) claims in respect of entitlement to benefit under the scheme made prior to this Agency Agreement are to be determined by the Department.
 - (f) cases that are already under investigation or subject to legal proceedings before this Agency Agreement comes into operation are to be investigated and proceeded against as if this Agreement had not been made.

Review of Agreement

- 15. This Agreement will be reviewed as considered appropriate by the Department.
- 16. The NHSBSA is directed to operate the Healthy Start Scheme and undertake those functions referred to as Specified Functions, unless and until, it is instructed in writing, by an authorised officer of the Department of Health, (on behalf of the Minister for the

Department of Health), on reasonable notice to suspend and/or permanently end the Agreement.

17. This agreement shall come into operation on 22 October 2021.
